Depart London Heathrow on the overnight Kenya Airways flight to Nairobi, Kenya.

Offbeat Mara Camp, Masai Mara

Early morning arrival into Nairobi's Jomo Kenyatta International Airport. After completing entry formalities and collecting your luggage, you will be met by our representatives and transferred to the smaller Wilson Airport. Here, you will check in and connect with a scheduled morning light aircraft flight, southwest to the open plains of the Masai Mara.

Late morning arrival into the Mara North bush airstrip, where you are met by a representative from Offbeat Mara and transferred into camp, game viewing en route and arriving in time for lunch. The afternoon is at leisure to settle in before a late afternoon game viewing activity. Eight nights are spent at Offbeat Mara, staying in twin/single tents. Game viewing activities, hosted by Martin and the Offbeat guides are undertaken daily.

Offbeat Mara Camp is a 20 bed semi-permanent seasonal bush camp situated on the west bank of the Olare Orok River, in the Mara North Conservancy. Guests are accommodated in seven spacious tents, two of which are designed for families. The family tents have both double and twin bedrooms, each with their own en suite bathroom and are connected by an internal corridor. One of these tents can comfortably accommodate a family with three children. All tents are comfortably furnished with large cedar beds (a large king and single), writing desk and canvas wardrobe. The en suite facilities include double wash basin (for which water is provided in large jugs), flush loo and bucket shower. Lighting is provided through solar power and charging facilities are available in the mess tent and in the vehicles. The cosy mess tent consists of a bar at one end and a small sitting room with fireplace at the other with the dining area in between. There is also a forest deck that overlooks the river (a perfect spot for birdwatching). Limited Wi-Fi access is available in the mess tent. Please note that there are no credit card facilities in camp (any additional charges will need to be settled in cash).

Activities include game drives by day and night in custom designed Land Rovers/ Land Cruisers, nature walks, bush breakfasts and sundowners. It is also possible to visit a local village and rhino sanctuary (at extra cost). Most game viewing will take place on the plains around camp (with the Offbeat Lion pride being a large attraction!), but a visit into the official Mara Reserve may be undertaken when river crossings are happening during the migration period. The Mara Reserve fee will be charged at additional cost if not already included in your itinerary.

Offbeat Mara Camp is located outside the official Masai Mara Game Reserve within the Mara North Conservancy. Game viewing around the camp is superb and animals often wander through the camp at night. Lion, leopard, elephant, buffalo and giraffe are often seen from the verandahs of the tents themselves, and zebra and buffalo help keep the lawns short!

Masai Mara - Introduction

The Masai Mara, perhaps the world's most famous wildlife area, lies at an elevation of around 5,500 feet and is one of the few areas left in Africa where animals can be seen in the large numbers that existed a hundred years ago. The predominantly open grassland plains are dotted with trees and thickets, and incised with forested drainage lines and a couple of rivers which flow, or hold water, throughout the year (Mara River and Talek). The drier parts of the region have a few thickets of acacia woodland and whistling thorn.

The diverse habitat enables many different species to co-exist: elephant, black rhino, Masai giraffe, Cape buffalo, eland, Burchell's zebra, topi, Coke's hartebeest, wildebeest, waterbuck, impala, Thomson's gazelle, reedbuck, lion, leopard, cheetah, hyaena, jackal, genet, civet and serval, hippo, crocodile, baboon, vervet monkey, warthog, various mongoose species, and many more (we would be particularly interested to hear if you see roan antelope or oribi). During July to October, the Mara is home to the famous wildebeest migration which is accompanied by large numbers of zebra. Over 500 bird species have been recorded in the area, including Denham's bustard, Temminck's courser, yellow-throated sandgrouse, Usambiro barbet, saddle-billed stork and Gabon nightjar. Some 50 of the bird species are raptors; the large martial eagle even preys on small antelope. To the north of the National Reserve lie the communal lands of the Maasai people some of which are now incorporated into four exclusive conservancies -Mara North, OlareOrok/Motorogi, Naboisho and Ol Kinyei. These conservancies are a self-funded partnership between a few tourism partners (running camps and lodges) and the local communities, guaranteeing an annual income for every land owner in a transparent and well managed way. This has resulted in these conservancies offering a very exclusive wildlife viewing experience - the Olare, Kinyei and Naboisho in particular have very low bed/acre densities. The managed land use still allows the wildlife to mix freely with the local Maasai people, who can often be seen tending their livestock. They are a very proud people and an integral part of the 'landscape'.

Four Points by Sheraton, Nairobi Airport

Morning at leisure for a final game viewing activity. After lunch in camp, you will be transferred back to the local bush airstrip to connect with a scheduled light aircraft flight to Nairobi. Late afternoon arrival into Wilson Airport, where you are met by our representatives and transferred to the Four Points hotel for an overnight stay in twin/single rooms.

Four Points by Sheraton is located within the perimeter fence of Jomo Kenyatta International Airport about a six minute drive from the Airport terminals. Accommodation is in 172 modern air-conditioned Twin and King Rooms, Traditional, Deluxe and Executive suites. The main difference between the suites is the size with the Deluxe being slightly larger than the Standard with an extended sitting area. The Executive Suites are the largest. All have en suite bathrooms with double vanity, toilet and shower (the Executives have a bath). Other facilities include a writing desk, minibar, tea/coffee station, room safe, Smart TV, individual climate control, hairdryer, and Wi-Fi.

The main areas of the hotel consist of a coffee shop/evening bar, business centre, rooftop restaurant and pool deck, rooftop open air swimming pool, gymnasium and spa and the Market Place on the ground floor which is open 24 hours for all meals and contains both inside and outside seating.

After an early breakfast, connect with the Four Points courtesy shuttle service (it departs every five minutes) to the nearby terminal. Check in and connect with the daylight Kenya Airways flight to London Heathrow.

Mid-afternoon arrival into London Heathrow.


Michele Seamark, Director / Senior Sales
